What is NOT a pesticide?

- Products intended to control *internal* parasites, like antibiotics
- Products that are not intended for pest control, like household cleaning products that do not claim to disinfect
- Products that are intended for pest control but are not substances, such as mechanical devices (like mouse traps) or physical barriers (like mulch for weed suppression)

Always read and follow the label when applying a pesticide. The label is the law.
